Great changes are coming to the Durham West Arts Centre this Fall. With the support of the Ontario Trillium Foundation we will be hiring two new staff members—a Director to oversee the operations of the Arts Centre, and a Manager to head up its office affairs and train volunteers.

We will also have a new facility out of which to conduct our business, launch exhibitions of art, and develop our plans for the future. As you will see from elsewhere in this newsletter the space is undergoing renovations. Look for an announcement soon of our Grand Opening.

This Fall will also witness some major changes in the Board's composition. A new Chair and a new Vice Chair will be named at the Annual General Meeting in October. After a three-year term (as provided by DWAC's Constitution) I will be stepping down as Chair and moving into the position of Past Chair. At present we lack a Vice Chair so this position—a three-year appointment—will also have to be filled.

Edward Falkenberg, one of DWAC's founders and its first Chair, who has been serving as Past Chair for three years will be leaving the Board. Edward has been the inspiration for DWAC and has made sure that its artistic integrity has been consistently maintained. We will miss him on the Board, but we know his presence will be felt in many other ways.
